

FROM DROPOUTS TO MISSIONARIES

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## INTRODUCTION

This is a story and a vision of a young youth evangelist that started in 1965. It is about insights God gave him over 40 + years that resulted in a multiplying ministry in youth evangelism. Over the years thousands of youth and adult leaders were trained. Hundreds of thousands of people heard about Jesus death for their sins and future in heaven. These thousands of youth, their leaders and families were affected spiritually but the ultimate goal of evangelism becoming a "way of life", caught by OAFcers, still eludes most LCMS members to the point the church is not growing.

Now for the rest of the story! At 78 years of age, the founder of this movement, Ongoing Ambassadors for Christ, feels God has given him the key to how LCMS families can make sharing Christ a "way of life"! This comes when it is reported youth are dropping out of the church at a rate of 50-90% when they attend college. It comes when George Barna predicts the Christian Church will diminish by 50% in the next 20 years and the Muslims say they will take over the US in ten years.

What successes of the past, challenges of today and wisdom of God can grant a revival of our youth and families so our church can grow? How can God turn these present problems into challenges and future winnable mission fields? How can the LCMS become a "Real Giant" in winning the lost to Jesus instead of the "Sleeping Giant" Billy Graham has called us?

We, humanly, can't figure this out but "with God all things are possible"! We knell in prayer, begging God for the solution! "Please, Dear Father, forgive us of our past neglect in sharing the cross of Christ with others. Open up the eyes, the ears, the minds, the hearts of our national leadership, of our leadership in Synodical schools, and in churches to Your word and solution. Destroy self glory and ambitions of men to gain power, prestige or monetary gain. We ask for broken hearts because of our neglect of sharing the most precious and enduring gift of Christianity, eternal life through believing Jesus died for our sins. We simply ask to be used for the salvation of many souls to your honor, your glory and the growth of your Church. We pray in Jesus name. Amen."

"There is an army taking over America. It is taking over every school, every church, every government position, every branch of the military and we can tell you who that army is. That army is the youth of America"! If you want to know what the future of the United States will be, look at our youth. If you like what you see the future is bright, if not we are in trouble.

### TROUBLE IN YOUTH WORK

What do we see today with our youth? George Barna says we are losing between 50 – 90% of our youth when they go to college. Even the youth minded Southern Baptist claim they are losing about 88% of their youth.

#### A LCMS pastor put it this way:

Out of 100 Lutheran children born only 50 are baptized.	-50
Out of the 50 children baptized only 25 are confirmed.	-25
Out of the 25 confirmed only 12.5 remain active in church,	-12.5
Out of 100 children born to Lutheran parents we loose	-87.5%

If this is true that is awful!

### WHAT DO THE YOUTH SAY?

The above doesn't sound very good so let's see what youth have to say.

Here is what a serious young person says, "I am a 17 year old and am saddened that adults somehow think they have to entertain and attract us to youth groups. Adults have no idea that **half the kids (50% factor, (1))** in their group **are serious about God** but don't ever go deeper because they are still spoon-fed along with the half that doesn't care. Give us the teachings we crave and the half of us who care will become warriors for God and the half of us who don't care will leave". Lord, help us to save our serious 50% of youth, and build an army of warriors to win the lost for You!

Here is what Ruth Meseke said in the Lutheran Witness Reporter, "I am a senior at a Lutheran high school and worship at my Lutheran church every Sunday. I have seen my youth group suffer from the **members' lack of interest** in what the church has to offer (youth, our future leaders). I don't think the question is why we lack commitment to Christ, but the kind of

**examples** we have been given to follow. There needs to be more than the teachings of Jesus' death on the cross; the **witnessing and the living (2)** of this conviction **needs to be the more prevalent** aspect of the church's ministering. Many of us have grown up hearing about God, and yet no one has taken the initiative to help us really know Him.

Memorizing stories in the Bible is not what will save our souls, but a **simple and true faith**. This is what I feel is missing from the youth in the country, an **intimate relationship** with their Creator, not simply knowledge that He is out there." (3)

### SOME OPTIMISTIC INFORMATION

In spite of "Trouble in Youth Work" above, our Synodical LCMS youth Director is encouraging by lining up large annual District and periodic National Youth Rallies. At these rallies some of the best speakers and musicians in America are brought before our youth. They also prepare Summer Outreach Teams in the US and overseas. Through these means the LCMS youth Director Leader claims we keep 87% of our youth in the church! That is great when so many youth are dropping out of the church.

Another optimistic note is the OAF youth evangelism organization of the LCMS. It was analyzed by Dr. Kent Hunter who said, "Hundreds of youth and adults have a spark of enthusiasm, a depth of commitment, and an interest and concern that (OAF) continue and improve. It was a delightful experience to hear their beautiful heartwarming witness to their Savior. This was a **natural part of the lifestyle of these people. (4)** This characteristic witness to the faith flies like a banner over these people". Do you see this in the youth of your church? How did this happen?

These youth and leaders meet **monthly** for training and witnessing for LCMS congregations. (5) Beyond this they have National training in the summer and New Year's training. Teams go out on teams following National training in the summer and college teams during Spring Break. They conduct evangelism services in congregations and start new groups. This becomes mass **discipling. (6)** While doing this they use the 2 Timothy 2:2 principle by "training men who can train men" and develop many young leaders who become professional and lay leaders in our churches.

In the meantime families are falling apart. (7) Although a 2000 report by AAL said Lutherans have the lowest divorce rate around 50% of US families are reported to be single parent families. How can we help keep families together? How can we help these overloaded single parents be both mother and father while often being the lone bread winner also? There are **two significant factors** God showed us in O AFC that I believe can help the family as well as the church.

**FIRST** there is a **type of catechism** that was used by O AFC that made them doctrinally strong. (8) It is called, Back to the Bible Catechism, which was used in churches by the founder of O AFC. Youth would not be required to use Luther's Catechism and be forced to memorize a bunch of passages. Instead each would get a fresh NKJV of the Bible. Then they would mark and cross reference proof passages for the fundamental doctrines of Christianity. Then they would be drilled in where to find things in the Bible. Their catechism quiz before confirmation would show the congregation what they believed directly from the Bible. The parents were impressed and even the Elders couldn't compete with them.

O AFC youth were introduced to this but used a **small NKJV**. They would cross-reference them and compete against each other. Eventually this was part of National O AFC training and the youth liked to compete against the leaders. It was embarrassing when the youth would beat the leaders. However, it was preparing them for one of the most significant confrontations that I feel will affect the LCMS forever!

**SECOND**, while training O AFC youth in St. Louis to witness to Jehovah Witnesses the youth found out there were thousands of them gathered in a big convention in Busch Stadium. The youth said, "Let's go get them"! We made some fake JW tracts that said, "Jesus is God and the only way to heaven". Over a hundred O AFC youth and leaders surrounded the stadium in teams of two. Eventually the rally was over and thousands of JWs came out and took the tracts. They read them, threw them down at the feet of the youth and began to argue with them. What they didn't know was that the youth had "pistols" **marked New Testaments** that they used to point out what they believed. It was hard to pull the youth away. Later that night a radio announcer asked the leader of the JWs, "How is your convention doing"? He said it was going great but there were some Lutheran teenagers

harassing them. I'll bet all the Christians in St. Louis were rejoicing! Finally, someone had successfully stood up to the Jehovah Witnesses and won! **THESE WERE LCMS YOUTH USING LCMS DOCTRINE AND THEY DID IT!** Could that be the "Real Giant" LCMS Billy Graham has called the "Sleeping Giant" for many years? Can it be done again?

A mission director of a district put it this way, "We have two options: 1. We can have a **slow painful death**, or 2. We can have a **deep painful gain**"! The choice is ours! May God empower, and encourage us to make deep spiritual gains! May He give us the desire, the determination and the fortitude to work to preserve our wonderful Lutheran Church and make it the giant it was intended to be!

#### A VISION OF GOD FOR THE LCMS

(Without a vision the people perish)

**First**, the Lord gave the author a **vision** of how this could be used to make the LCMS that "Real Giant" that God could use to bring America back to "making disciples of all nations"! That vision is to encourage all LCMS churches to use "Back to the Bible Catechism". Then each year when youth are confirmed have the best youth in each local church compete against the best in the churches in each circuit. After finding the best in the circuits have them compete against the best in the Districts. Then the best in the Districts compete to see who is best in Synod. That would produce a generation of youth who know what they believe from the Bible and following generations eager to learn to do the same. Lutherans would be able to show others the doctrine that makes the LCMS great! The parents and children coming up in the LCMS would know how they will be trained and become strong and proud members of a Bible based evangelical church. Changes are painful. Are we willing to make them to survive?

A **second vision** is to have every 7<sup>th</sup> grade catechism student join O AFC, Family Evangelism or a witnessing group right away! Then they not only learn what they believe from the Bible but will be sharing that monthly in outreach groups and also in everyday life from 7<sup>th</sup> grade until they go to college. When in the seminary many pastors found out they learned more on their vicarage than in seminary because they put into practice what they learned. Then, youth, after six years of sharing Christ and His doctrines

monthly will go to college but will not become drop outs. They will enter college as well trained and mature missionaries to work with a **vision** to win that 50 to 90% for Jesus. They can win them for their Church while carrying out the Great Commission in Matthew 28:19-20. While in college, in the summer, they can use their talents on summer traveling teams or in helping to plant churches or do other kinds of real "Ablaze" work leading people to Jesus! Furthermore, during the 5 or 6 years of sharing Christ monthly they could be part of a **multiplying ministry** reproducing themselves over 60 times in training others if they trained one new person each month. It would not only be "ongoing" monthly training but "**reproducing**" and "**discipling**" like in 2 Tim 2:2.

Additional blessings of belonging to a group like O AFC is that the ongoing training and sharing every month helps trainees become better at sharing Christ. Practice **reduces fear** and **sharing Christ becomes a way of life**. Another blessing is that single parent children can have a positive, Christ centered, discipling family to belong to and mature Christian adult leaders to help model Christian parenting. This is also good for small congregations who have few youth. **One weekend a month** they can be part of a strong, **positive and spiritual family** of LCMS members.

Groups of youth and adults doing evangelistic services monthly can start an evangelism **tradition** which will influence the children and family at little or no cost but transportation. Many children can't afford going to big, costly rallies but can have good Christian fellowship and training while serving the church through monthly witnessing. I believe "going to church should be a treat, not a treatment, something you **enjoy**, not something you endure". Church should not just be "one size fits all" which is usually geared for adults. It should also be enjoyable **for our** future leaders, our **children and youth**. They want to be up front and active but if we "don't **use them** we lose them". Having Christ centered puppets, dramas, and songs little children can sing and led by youth will give the children something to dream about and want to do when they get into confirmation class. And all these enjoyable parts of the service can be doctrinally sound, enjoyable for children and youth and keep families wanting to go to their church. While being enjoyable each service can have the way to heaven in them so they can lead people to saving faith in Jesus which is the ultimate goal of Christianity.

I know that society makes many demands on families and keeps everyone very busy. By making this training a priority early in children's lives they can have a spiritual weekend vacation with Jesus each month. When training youth, the Lutheran Youth Encounter warned me about just training the youth. When youth come home spiritually strong, parents don't understand as they didn't have the same training. However, why not make these weekends for **youth and their parents**. Recently at a weekend in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma we did have parents and teens together which was very successful and may become a future trend, Family Evangelism Weekends for Jesus. Parents also went out witnessing and joined their children in the Christ centered singing and drama in the Sunday worship.

I know pastors receive little evangelism training in seminary and because of it are often negative and fearful about knocking on doors. Just because the JW and the Mormons have abused it doesn't mean it is wrong. The growing Southern Baptist do it and all these are growing churches. Many Christians have said when we visit them, "It is about time Christians knock on our doors" and are very appreciative of our calls. Many have told me, "You are the only pastor who has ever been in our home"! How sad! It is true knocking on doors is not the most productive witnessing method and may be that "painful gain" we have to endure! BUT it **breaks the "fear barrier"** so eventually sharing Jesus to get to heaven becomes a "way of life"! After that trainees are more prone to share Jesus in everyday situations. In early youth evangelism training youth were asked, "What do you fear most"? They all said, "knocking on doors"! However, when asked what they enjoyed most about the weekends they all said, "they enjoyed knocking on doors" the most! In sharing Christ those who share are the greatest winners for in sharing, ones faith becomes stronger.

A key to knocking on doors is **follow up!** Dr. Kent Hunter noted in his analysis of O AFC that the lack of follow up is a weakness. Most churches do not follow up the prospects but one church that does in Minnesota said that half of their new members are from O AFC calls because they followed them up! Other follow up churches said similar things. In Family Evangelism we encourage follow up on the Sunday afternoon after the Saturday calls by the trainees and members of the local church. We give them a DVD of a power point sermon on "The Cross" if they have a DVD player and promise to watch it. Then in this third call when we pick them up

during the week and share more. They say it takes over **7.5 calls** to lead a person to Christ. The secret is follow up, follow up and more follow up. In quantity these DVD's can be ordered at reduced prices along with other follow up materials or you can get materials from LLL or other sources.

The following is a schedule of a family evangelism weekend which can be used by a single congregation or a circuit of congregations but the key is follow up:

### MONTHLY FAMILY VACATION WITH JESUS

These weekends should start on or before the 7<sup>th</sup> grade when they start their catechism and all family members. Youth should be accompanied by their parents, especially fathers, if possible, so both parents and teenagers grow spiritually together. All materials for the weekend can be provided by the D. I. E. office in Winfield, Kansas. For information call 620-221-4765.

#### SATURDAY:

- 8:30 AM Arrive and sign in.
  - 9:00 AM Overview and Bible Study
  - 10:00 AM Simple Simon Survey and John 3:16 method training
  - 10:30 AM Guy and girl teams sent out
  - 12:00 Noon Light Lunch for the teams by the church
  - 1:00 PM Sharing and tabulation
  - 2:00 PM Training in Drama, Puppets, Singing, Witnessing Methods, Testimonials, Bible Study and Sunday Service planning
  - 4:00 PM Back to the Bible Catechism, marking Bibles and drilling
  - 5:00 PM Closing prayer.
- There can be some other options, like visiting a Rest Home with the aged or watching evangelistic movies etc..

#### SUNDAY:

The team will share Jesus in some of the above ways they are trained in the Worship Service, Sunday School or Bible Classes. We ask for a free will offering to defray expenses and to solicit prayer supporters.

12:00 Noon A pot luck for the congregations to meet and visit with the trainees.

- 1:00 PM Follow up by those who found unchurched with members of the local church with DVD's of "THE CROSS METHOD"
- 1:30 pm Evaluation of the weekend

### EVANGELISM FROM THE CRADLE TO THE GRAVE (This can be done in Sunday, Weekday, Saturday or Home Schools)

1. Ages 0-3 Pre-Cradle and New Born – This is a time of joy but also when people need help. All, but especially grandparents can watch for expectant mothers and pray for them and volunteer to help them. Teach them Children's Garden of Bible Stories – Child's First Bible – Five words to get to heaven JESUS DIED FOR MY SINS  
Five words to tell I SHALL GO TO HEAVEN
2. Ages 3-4 Memorize the Commandments – Also Concordia Weekday. Saturday. Sunday or Home School materials.
3. Ages 5-6 Memorize the Books of the Bible plus next two five words  
Five words to go and tell I'LL TELL OTHERS ABOUT JESUS  
Five words to tell where go THEY WILL GO TO HEAVEN  
Concordia Materials + Sunday School Surveys with parents  
Know where to find the Commandments, Christmas, Easter etc.
4. Ages 7-8 Regular Concordia Materials + Family Sunday School Surveys - Evangelistic Songs "Don't You Know" – Basic concepts
5. Ages 9-10 Regular Concordia Materials + Family Sunday School Surveys – Evangelistic Songs – Puppets - Dramas
6. Ages 11-12 Back to the Bible Catechism + Types of Bible Studies  
If a gym is available have neighborhood sports to get acquainted with unchurched neighbor children to eventually bring them to Jesus.

### PHASE TWO, CRADLE TO THE GRAVE

## MONTHLY FAMILY VACATION WITH JESUS

These weekends are for youth and their parents or adults who bring single parent's youth for the weekend with their parent's permission. This can help some single parents raise their one parent child and have them in a positive Christian family once a month. This also allows parents and teenagers grow together spiritually and helps families stay together.

**First**, Simple Simon Surveys will be used by the youth which merely finds out if people go to church. During their training until they graduate from High School they will also be trained in the OAFS survey and others for Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Weekday School, all good outreach surveys to find the unchurched in positive, direct and loving ways. Adults will be trained right away to follow up the unchurched and as youth mature they will also be trained to follow up using various witnessing methods in their years of training.

**Second**, the **witnessing methods** will progress from the simple John 3:16, the OAFS Assurance of Heaven, Share Jesus Without Fear (marked NT), The Cross Method (DVD), Evangelism Explosion and Back to the Bible Catechism. By the time youth get to college they will be very well trained and should be excellent Missionaries to win the college drop outs.

**Third**, **methods of presenting Jesus** suffering, death and resurrection in the **congregations** will also be taught. These will be ultra Christ centered training with the intent that each of these methods will clearly present the way to heaven. Methods include singing, drama, puppets, testimonials, Bible Studies, witnessing methods. As youth are trained many have become creative and are encouraged to create and write new dramas, etc. What they have done in OAFS, they will be encouraged to do in Family Evangelism.

**Forth**, trainees will become familiar with **other sources of evangelism training** like Summitt (2 week worldview exposure), Worldview (weekend conferences), Navigators (weekend on discipleship), Campus Crusade for Christ (college evangelism) looking at them with "Lutheran Eyes". They will learn good ideas from all but note faulty areas to avoid. They will become well rounded missionaries. They may experiment with forms of recreational evangelism and attend basketball camps in Alaska, etc. In

general they will learn to be "all things to all men in order by all means some might be saved" for an eternity in heaven!

**Fifth**, this training will be held to train **lay leaders at little or no cost** but will use the tools of God to support the training, **prayer and faith**. We will trust that God will give us prayer and financial support through freewill offerings and volunteer prayer supporters. Pastors should back and be examples in this training by going out with the youth but **laymen will be trained to lead**.

**Sixth**, after five years and 3 months of training in sponsoring churches, (63 weekends), if they attend every weekend by bringing others each month each will have the opportunity of training 63 new trainees. This becomes a **multiplying ministry** where sharing Christ with others becomes a **way of life** in the church which is the goal of Family Evangelism.

## SEND THEM TO COLLEGE AS MISSIONARIES

After these six years of training our youth will have an evangelism training that no other denomination will have. They will be equipped with the tools to seek to **bring college drop outs to Jesus** and into our church. With God's blessing of these plans our church can become the "giant" it was intended to be.

### PRINCIPLES OF YOUTH EVANGELISM

1. The **50% factor** indicates a **large number of youth want to be serious** about their church. O AFC is an ultra Christ centered organization and youth were told that when they started. We told them if they wanted to be part of a strict Christ centered organization and seek to live for Jesus they were welcome, but if not they should drop out now and avoid conflict later. However if we kept the potential problem makers and they caused problems the good ones would drop out saying, "I thought this was Christ centered" and you have nothing left. Some dropouts would come back later and often became good leaders.
2. When youth would attend the **first weekend we gave them a test on "Why should God let you into heaven"** and most of these confirmed youth got the wrong answer! However, at the end we gave the same test and **consistently got 100%** after they had been out witnessing. Through this we could determine if they found the simple saving faith that Jesus died for their sins.
3. **Witnessing by the way one lives and sharing Christ** with others is key. That is what teenager Ruth Meske complained about adults NOT doing in her church in her Lutheran Witness article.
4. Dr. Kent Hunter, in his analysis of O AFC said, "Sharing Christ was a **"natural part of the lifestyle"** with O AFC trainees. This is also the goal of Family Evangelism for all LCMS members and so become a traditionally evangelistic church.
5. **Regular ongoing monthly weekends are important** to grow in ability to share Christ, recruiting, training others and in having a multiplying ministry like the Christians had in the book of Acts. It is also important to make establish monthly witnessing as a **priority**.

- When a family has no children the family dies out. It is the same with the church; it must reproduce other Christians to survive.
6. Multiple **discipling** happens when people attend these monthly weekends consistently and **recruit others** to become the future missionaries to college youth.
  7. Families are falling apart but Family Evangelism can help families do the **most important thing** in life together **sharing Christ** and letting His love keep families together forever.
  8. **Back to the Bible Catechism** is taking passages out of the catechism and marking and cross referencing them in your personal Bible. Then students are drilled in finding the passages quickly so they can share with others when needed. This not only makes youth and adults spiritually strong but prepares for strong leadership with **teenagers up front leading instead of leaving**.
  9. **Youth in small congregations** can have very Christ centered and challenging **get togethers monthly with other Lutherans friends**.
  10. Having parents and children witnessing together can provide a spiritual closeness. By having **fathers and sons** actively sharing Christ together it can help them be **active members and remain** in the church. Promise Keepers say only about 7% of boys are saved.
  11. The interesting part is these weekends they **cost nothing but time and transportation**. The local congregation is served and provides facilities, food, prayer supporters and a freewill offering when the program is at their church. It is a win, win, win situation.
  12. I have a philosophy that **going to church "ought to be a treat**, not a treatment, something you **(all) enjoy**, not something you endure"! The way Christ is shared in a variety of ways is of **interest to all ages**, especially **Children** (watching the puppets and singing) and the teens up front as leaders in the service.
  13. This kind of weekend can not only help **eliminate the "fear barrier"** but also increase the "fun or enjoyment" so **all are "glad when parents say let us go into the house of the Lord."** Parents can be proud when they see their youth enjoying serving their Lord. Just because something is fun is not bad if it keeps children and youth in the church without compromising what the Bible says.
  14. **Challenged youth** have **created** many of our Jesus songs, puppet shows, dramas and many have gone on to **full time church work**.

15. After 40+ years working with youth I believe "we **use them or lose them**"! They want to be the church NOW so my prayer is that God will allow you to view these materials with open minds, hearts and eyes to see how we can keep our children and youth and have a mighty church in the future,
16. With God's blessings those who enter Synodical schools and Seminaries will have well trained evangelists coming in to be our Church leaders because sharing Christ has become a "way of life" in our churches.

How do I have the audacity to present these plans for consideration at 78 years of age **First, I can't do anything** nor have I done anything in the past because, "it is God that works in us both to will and to do of His good pleasure"! God did it, He gets the praise! **Second, He allowed** me and other leaders **to start and direct Ongoing Ambassadors for Christ** that began with 24 trainees who multiplied into thousands trained to share Christ with tens of thousands all over the US and some overseas. Although I have retired from directing it, OAFIC is still going today. **Third, through OAFIC** He allowed Pastor Kenneth Roever to lead the **first Lutheran School of Evangelism** in Wichita Falls, Texas. **Fourth, now** He has given us a **vision during hard times in Christianity**. He has given my wife Rita and I an extended family of over 40 that we are praying will all be in heaven with us someday. At our age this makes these plans urgent to us personally and to all who love their families! May God bless and use this presentation to His glory and the strengthening of the LCMS.

Conclusion: "Heavenly Father, help those who read and decide what to do with this presentation, be guided by the Holy Spirit that it will change LCMS families as it did in Ongoing Ambassadors for Christ. Move leaders to plan having **pilot projects** in churches of our country in various Districts next fall or sooner. And may our church become a real giant in Training youth and parents in evangelism work. We ask this for the salvation of many souls and to give honor and glory to You!

We pray in Jesus name. Amen
